RPEC 2023-2024 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

As approved by the RPEC Executive Board: August 22, 2023



TOP TIER PRIORITIES

- Be aggressive in maintaining and improving the financial integrity of the State retirement system:
 - Support full funding of employer contribution rates to pension plans as recommended by the State Actuary
 - Oppose efforts to create any new retirement plans for public employees that diminish benefit levels and/or compromise retirement security
 - Support only those modifications to retirement plans that do not threaten the financial integrity of the retirement system
 - Continue efforts to strengthen the role of active and retired DRS members in DRS governance
- Ensure comprehensive, affordable Public Employees' Benefits Board (PEBB) self-insured Medicare benefits by increasing the state's contribution to premiums. Urge PEBB to contain cost increases to participants, retain federal funds, and expand government self-insured Medicare health care options for Medicare-eligible retirees.
- Restore a permanent Plan 1 COLA when a reasonable unfunded liability balance is attained and maintained, as affirmed by the Office of the State Actuary. Adjust employer contribution rates to accommodate a permanent Plan 1 COLA like those available for Plans 2 and 3. Include the permanent Plan 1 COLA in the projected 2025/2027 biennium contribution rates.
- Support legislation that would propose an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Washington – through the mechanism of the State Legislature to ensure the integrity of public pensions as enforceable contracts.
- Protect and expand Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid and prevent privatization of Medicare.

STATE PRIORITIES

Retirement

- Be aggressive in maintaining and improving the financial integrity of the State retirement system:
 - Support full funding of employer contribution rates to pension plans as recommended by the State Actuary
 - Oppose efforts to create any new retirement plans for public employees that diminish benefit levels and/or compromise retirement security
 - Support only those modifications to retirement plans that do not threaten the financial integrity of the retirement system
 - Continue efforts to strengthen the role of active and retired DRS members in DRS governance
- Restore a permanent Plan 1 COLA when a reasonable unfunded liability balance is attained and maintained, as affirmed by the Office of the State Actuary. Adjust employer contribution rates to accommodate a permanent Plan 1 COLA like those available for Plans 2 and 3. Include the permanent Plan 1 COLA in the projected 2025/2027 biennium contribution rates.
- Expand access to the Minimum Retirement Benefit for Plan 1 PERS & TRS retirees who are over the age of 65 through a change to current legislation.
- Support legislation that would propose an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Washington – through the mechanism of the State Legislature to ensure the integrity of public pensions as enforceable contracts.

- Advocate for retirement security, particularly defined benefit-style pensions for all Washingtonians.
- Work in coalition with groups advocating for legislation that improves access to affordable housing.
- Work in coalition with groups seeking to correct the regressive nature of Washington's tax code.

Health Care

- Ensure comprehensive, affordable PEBB self-insured Medicare benefits by increasing the state's contribution to premiums. Urge PEBB to contain cost increases to participants, retain federal matching funds for self-insured Medicare options, and expand government self-insured options for Medicare-eligible retirees. Maintain retiree government self-insured health insurance options through PEBB at affordable costs and adequate level of benefit.
- Create access to affordable health care for all retired public sector employees.
- Support and monitor the Office of the Insurance Commissioner (OIC) in its regulation of Medicare supplement policies and rates to ensure quality plans are as affordable as possible. Advocate for the OIC to have a non-voting seat on PEBB.
- Work to improve benefits and maintain and expand access to Vision, Dental and Hearing coverage.

Contracting Out/Privatization

- Oppose efforts to privatize or contract out public services.

FEDERAL PRIORITIES

Social Security and Medicare

- Continue fight to protect Social Security and Medicare from privatization.
- Protect and expand Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid.
- Promote fair premiums for Medicare coverage.
- Support a Federal Government sponsored Universal Health Care Program.
- Work to pass legislation that eliminates the contribution cap to Social Security (\$142,800 in 2021) and adopts the CPI-E to calculate the cost-of-living adjustments.
- Support the full implementation of the Older Americans Act.
- Pursue affordable long-term care options for retirees.
- Fight for the elimination of the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO) which unfairly diminishes the Social Security benefit of some public employees.
- Oppose any deferment, reduction or elimination to the payroll taxes that fund Social Security and Medicare.
- Support legislation to revise the federal tax code to reflect progressive taxation, relieving the current tax burden on low- and middle-income persons and creating a fair-share tax for corporations.

RPEC ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION

- Continue to encourage RPEC member-volunteers to advance RPEC's legislative agenda, support lobbying activities year around and to create relationships with their Legislators.



LEGISLATIVE GOALS 2023-24

Overarching Goal for all TRS, PERS and SERS Plans

Ensure retirement security for all WEA-Retired Members

- Establish a true annual COLA for all retirement plans
- Increase Medicare subsidy and state contribution to healthcare coverage

Specific for TRS and PERS Plan 1

- Support continuation to eliminate unfunded liability

Specific for TRS and SERS Plan 2

- Allow members to retire at age 62 without a reduction in pension

- Allow five-year vesting without age restrictions

12 Tips on How to Communicate with Lawmakers

- 1. Build Relationships with Legislators during Interim.** Do not wait until legislative session to engage your legislators. Legislative session is breakneck pace. During session, legislators can have dozens of meetings with interest groups every single day and meetings are typically fifteen minutes max. In-district meetings during interim are more relaxed and allow for more time. Here are some ways to build relationships with legislators during interim:
 - ✓ **Invite legislators to your events and attend theirs.** Chapter meetings, outdoor community gatherings, townhalls, campaign and civic events, precinct and county party meetings, etc.
 - ✓ **Sign up for their newsletters (often e-newsletters) and stay connected on social media.**
 - ✓ **Stay in contact throughout the year.** Send them articles that are relevant to the issues, keep those event invitations coming, show up to their events (campaign events or townhalls).
- 2. Prepare for the Meeting and Know your Audience.** Decide what you want from the meeting. Learn about the legislator – how have they voted on the issues you care about? Identify what committees/positions the legislator serves on. Read their biography. What does the legislator care about? Frame the problem and solution using messaging that resonates with the values of the legislator. It is always worth your time to practice what you are going to say. Roleplaying can be helpful. Anticipate questions that you might be asked.
- 3. Identify a Speaker.** If you have decided on more than one person, pick a spokesperson or divide up the issues ahead of time.
- 4. Take a Deep Breath and Relax.** Your number one goal is to make a personal connection with the legislator. Go into the meeting with the mindset that you and the legislator are on the same team and want the same outcome.
- 5. Introduce and Give Thanks.** Everyone should introduce themselves briefly, include where you live (especially if you are a constituent) and your service. Gratitude goes a long way: find something to thank the legislator for – have they co-sponsored legislation? Made a great floor speech? Come to a chapter meeting or other event? Recognizing the legislator's work shows that they are seen and appreciated and helps keep them invested in doing more.
- 6. Get to the Point.** Tell the legislator why you are there to see them. Refer to specific legislation when possible. Be sure your message is short and concise. Most meetings with legislators during the legislative session are short – anywhere from 2-15 minutes. Sometimes legislators misdirect or steer the conversation in a different direction. Stick to your key messaging and bring it back to your main points.

7. **Illustrate the Problem by Using a Personal Story.** Technical jargon doesn't change hearts and minds - personal stories do. How does this issue affect you and the people you care about? How have you been burdened without a COLA and/or with increased health care costs?
 8. **Close the Deal – Make an Ask.** Don't just ask for support. Ask for a specific commitment. If you want the legislator to vote for a particular bill, ask them "can we count on your vote for this bill (in committee/on the floor)?" Get a firm yes or no answer.
 9. **Inquire and Listen.** Learn what is important to the legislator, how they make decisions, and what questions they have. It helps you build a relationship, and it helps you be a more effective advocate. You can conclude the conversation by asking "what can I do to help you with this issue?" Be nimble and conversational.
 10. **Leave Information and Follow Up.** Leave a fact sheet, legislative agenda, or other background information at the end of the meeting. Give this information *at the end of the meeting* so the legislator will focus on you and not get distracted by reading while talking with you. Send an email or a note thanking them for the meeting, restating your message, and provide electronic copies of priority information. *Note that many legislative offices only accept electronic materials.
 11. **Get to Know the Legislative Assistant.** If the legislator is not available, it's useful to meet with the legislative assistant (LA) as a backup. LA's convey your message to the legislator. LA's are gatekeepers. Building a positive relationship with them can help gain access to the legislator.
 12. **Record Notes Immediately.** Take notes immediately following the meeting while the information is fresh in your mind. Submit meeting feedback on the RPEC website.

Staying on Message

When we talk to someone we want to influence, especially a legislator, we know what we want to say, but we're often thrown off by a question, misdirection, odd comment, or nerves. Use this simple technique to stay on message: **Acknowledge, Redirect, and Return.**

Acknowledge: It's important to be polite, so the first step in returning to YOUR message is to acknowledge what has been said. For example, "It sounds like you feel strongly about the importance of reforming government to maximize efficiency."

Redirect: While that may not be what you want to talk about, you want the other person to have a way to get the information they've asked about, so you can redirect them. For example, "I agree we should explore all avenues to ensure our communities are being served."

Return: Now you've easily tucked away the other topic and can return to the meeting topic. For example, "And the reason I'm here to talk to you today is to _____." You can then turn back to your personal story or to a talking point describing why this is important to you or your community.

A Handy Guide to Crafting Your Message

You can use your hand to help structure your Lobby Day meeting and make sure you say all you need to say.

The first finger—the thumb—is “Introduce yourself.”

Tell your legislator your name, where you live, and that you are one of their constituents.

The second finger—the index finger—is “What is my issue.”

You want to say, “I’m here to talk with you about Worker safety and privacy – HB 1888” or any other issue you’re here for. Outline the basic topic and describe the bill.

The third finger—the middle finger—is “Why I care.”

This is where you share your personal story, and you can begin in many different ways. For example, “I care about this issue because . . .” or “This issue is important to me because . . .”

The fourth finger—the ring finger—is “Why the Legislator should care.”

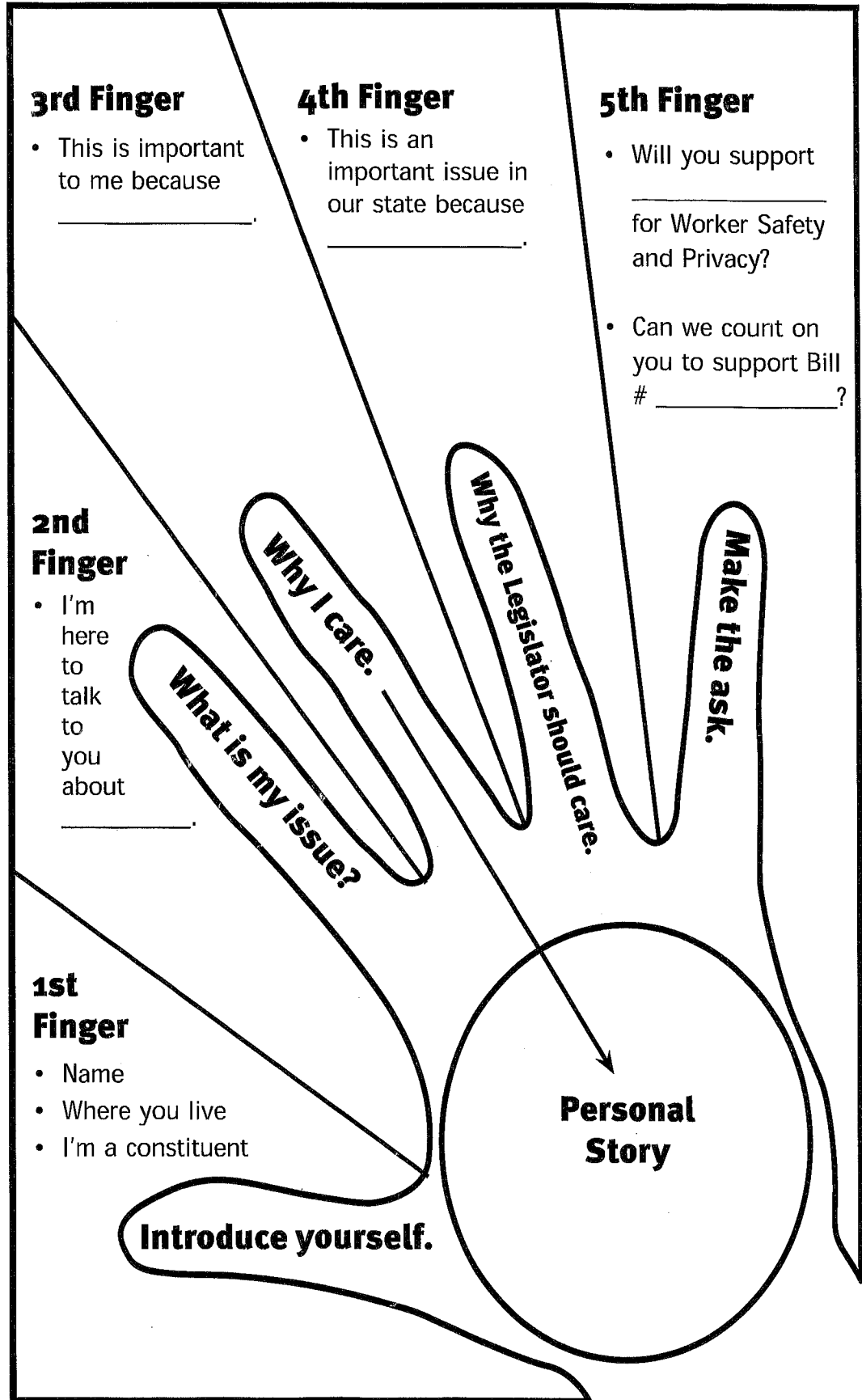
This is where you use the talking points and messages from our fact sheet. Some examples are, “This is important because HB 1888 would protect the safety and privacy of public employees and their families,” or “Did you know that Washington’s Public Records Act explicitly aims to protect the privacy and safety of public employees, and in 2020, access to a name and birth date make it easy to find home addresses online? It’s up to the Legislature to update the PRA.” Just be sure that all the facts you use come from the fact sheet!

The fifth finger—the pinky—is “Make the ask.”

This is the part where you ask for their support. You can say, “Will you support bill # _____” and “Can we count on you to _____ for Worker Privacy and Safety?”

Finally, the whole hand – is a handshake and “Thank you for your time.”

Be sure to express your appreciation for the legislator’s time and for considering the issues you’ve brought up today.



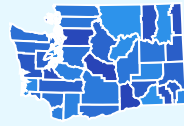

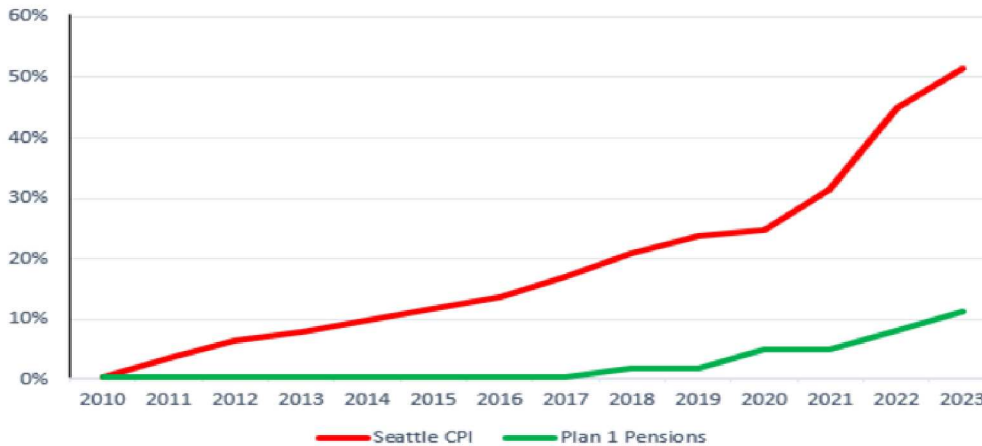

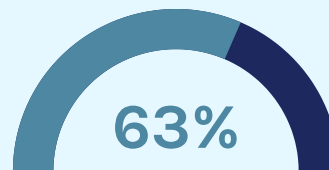

A Member's Story - Zaida Zapata Quimby, Seattle

"My name is Zaida; I am an 84 year old widow. I worked for King County Metro from 1963 until my retirement in 1999. Unable to survive on my pension, in 2000 I went back to work as an usher at Benaroya Hall/Seattle Symphony. I tried to retire again in 2021 due to ongoing health issues but was forced to return to work in 2022 to pay my bills. I can now only work four or five days a month due to ongoing health issues that impact my mobility.

Since my husband passed in 1998, life has not been easy. My mortgage, life insurance, and long term care insurance cost \$2,741 per month, while I receive \$2,698 from my PERS 1 pension, leaving me \$43 in debt.

A Plan 1 COLA would significantly improve my quality of life. Please support HB 1985 to provide me with relief from inflation so I can afford to retire for good."



Solutions



Pass HB 1985 to provide Plan 1 retirees with relief from inflation in 2024.

A livable pension, that accounts for inflationary pressure, will help to provide food and housing security for Washington's oldest public sector retirees.



Looking Ahead



In 2023, the Legislature passed SB 5350, which requires the Select Committee on Pension Policy (SCPP) to study and recommend an ongoing COLA proposal for Plan 1 retirees. The SCPP is expected to complete this task by the end of the 2024 interim. In 2025, the Legislature can settle the Plan 1 COLA issue for good by adopting an ongoing COLA for Plan 1 retirees. Please make 2024 the last time a one-time COLA is ever needed.



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Increase the PEBB Medicare Explicit Subsidy to Protect Retirees from Rising Health Care Costs

Pass HB 2188/ SB 6139

What is the PEBB Medicare Explicit Subsidy?



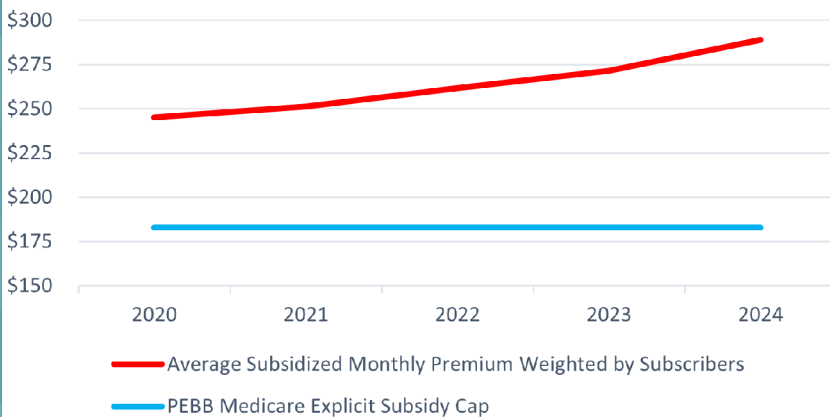
The state provides a subsidy for Medicare-eligible retirees who get health insurance through the Public Employees Benefits Board (PEBB). The state pays 50% of retiree health insurance premiums, but the subsidy is capped at \$183 per month.

What is the issue?

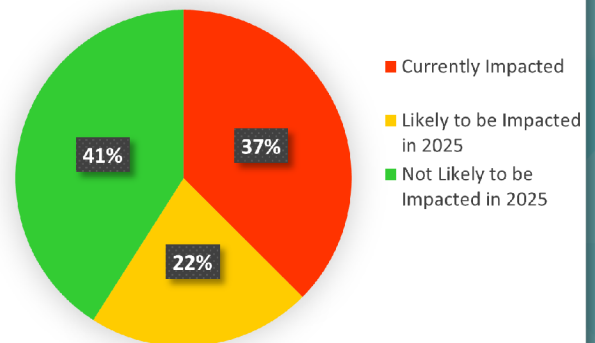


The PEBB Medicare Explicit Subsidy is not keeping pace with expanding health care costs. The \$183 subsidy cap was established in 2009. Fifteen (15) years later, the subsidy cap remains unchanged.

What is the Solution?



Expand the PEBB Medicare Explicit Subsidy cap via a budget request

The \$183 cap on the PEBB Medicare explicit subsidy is written into the operating budget. By raising it to \$202, all PEBB retirees will receive additional support if their premiums increase next year. An increase to \$193 is funded in the Governor's budget.



Pass HB 2188/ SB 6139

HB 2188/SB 6139 will expand the PEBB Medicare explicit subsidy rate from 50% to 60% of monthly health insurance premiums. If adopted, the PEBB plans not impacted by the cap will get additional assistance with rising health care costs. It is funded in the Governor's Budget.

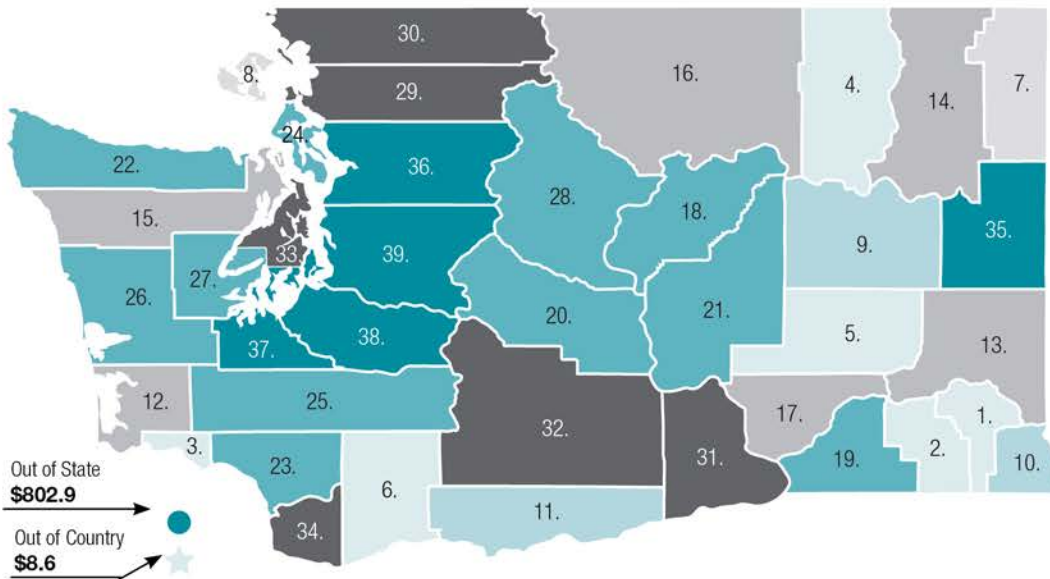

"My name is Laura and I'm from the 22nd district here in Olympia. I've been working for the Department of Natural Resources for 15 years. I chose to work in public service because I believe protecting state lands and natural resources is key to having healthy communities all across our state.

As a response coordinator, I dispatch resources to protect state lands from wildfire and other natural disasters/hazards. In the past 5 years, I have seen a lack of competitive pay and the resulting staffing crisis in Washington impact my work and the people I serve. The state's inability to recruit and retain public workers have led to resource and personnel reduction. For example: we used to have 7 responders for a large incident - now we only have 4. It takes those 4 responders nearly twice as long to suppress an incident and ends up costing the state more money and damaging more of our precious resources.

I took time off work today to ask you to fund our 2023-25 contract. With your help we can protect our natural resources for this generation and the next. Can I count on you to fund our 2023-25 contract so we can solve the staffing crisis in Washington and protect our state lands?"

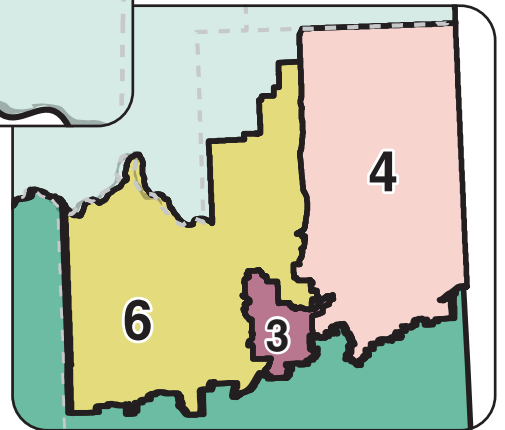

2023 STATEWIDE LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT MAP WITH LEGISLATIVE MEMBERS

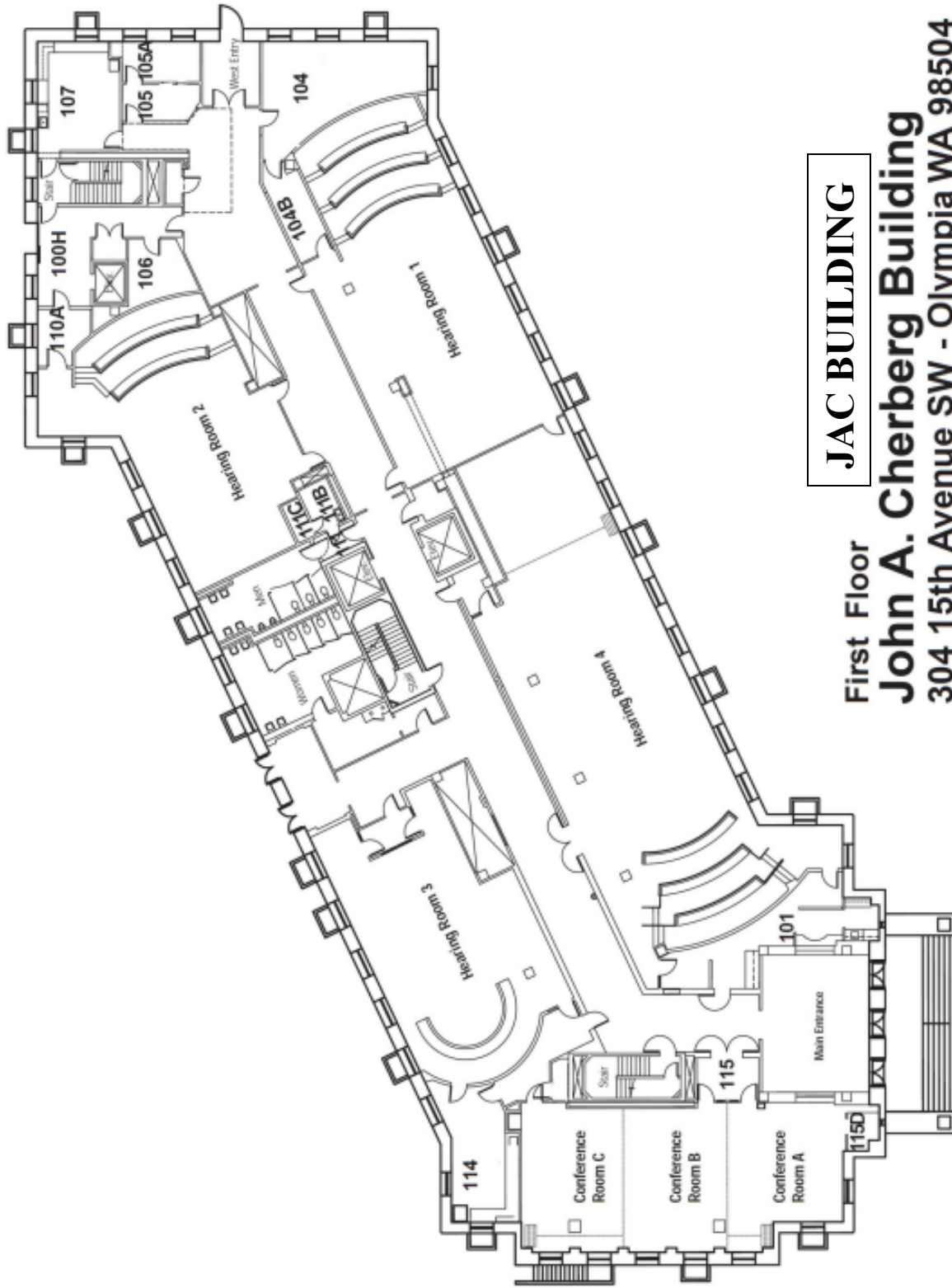

Virtual Legislative Meeting Guidelines

Please read the guidelines below for important information on how to engage in your virtual meeting with your Legislators.

**Disclaimer: Every legislative office has a slightly different method of conducting virtual meetings. The following information should be helpful for meeting with offices that use ZOOM.*

Join the meeting at least 5 minutes early! Upon entering the virtual meeting room, you will be placed into a Waiting Room until your appointment time.

Once you are let in, please ensure your display name is renamed to list your name and "RPEC/WEA-R". Ex: (Emmett Mills, RPEC/WEA-R).

To rename yourself after joining a meeting on a computer:

1. Click the "Participants" button at the bottom of the meeting window.
2. A list of all participants in the meeting should appear on the right side of the window. Find your account name, hover your cursor over it, and click "More".
3. Click "Rename".
4. Type in your name followed by "RPEC/WEA-R".
5. Click "OK"

Meeting end times will be strictly enforced. When your meeting is over, your group may be moved to an "exit lobby" breakout room from which you can leave whenever you are ready.

Please do not share the meeting link publicly. You may share with confirmed meeting attendees from your group, but it may not be published or shared around outside of your group. Members who have not registered will not be let into meetings.
