PROPOSED RESOLUTION 6

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT STRATEGY

Whereas, the Retired Public Employees Council of Washington (RPEC) is a statechartered 501(c)5 corporation as well as a Retiree Council of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME); and

Whereas, RPEC is a bona fide service organization which, per the Preamble and
 Article III of RPEC's Constitution, exists exclusively "to unite Washington's public
 service retirees for their mutual benefit" <u>"to unite retired public employees in an</u>
 organization devoted to protection of retirees' rights, improve their welfare and
 happiness and to give the retirees a strong voice in making their views and
 concerns clearly known"; and

Whereas, per Article IV of RPEC's Constitution,
Imited to persons "eligible to receive benefits from the Washington PublicEmployees Retirement System (DRS)
benefits from the Washington Public Employees Retirement System
(DRS) open to persons "eligible to receive pensionbenefits from the Washington Public Employees Retirement System" and persons
in three other categories; and

Whereas, RPEC no longer has the ability to utilize DRS provided lists for membership recruitment purposes; and

Whereas, this withholding of eligible retirees contact information has harmed
 RPEC's ability to effectively and timely recruit retired public employees and
 thereby, fully execute its mission.

Therefore be it resolved, that AFSCME Retiree Chapter 10 work with AFSCME
Council 2 and 28 to develop their negotiated agency employment contracts to
ensure that RPEC membership information is provided to all Washington's public
employees during their agencies' retiree separation process.
